CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Accommodation at the College is available to Western Australian country secondary school students but is subject to the following conditions:

- a. **Prospective boarding students need to be accepted into a specialised course at a metropolitan Government secondary school (Refer below for details)**
or
- b. **Not have a Government high school in their town, or must travel more than 1 hour to a high school by bus - note: must have an acceptance letter from metropolitan Government secondary school.**
or
- c. **Their education is adversely affected by extreme travel distance (remote or isolated locations) note: must have an acceptance letter from metropolitan Government secondary school.**
or
- d. **Where your child is going into upper school and their local district high school does not have years 11 and 12.**

Please be advised that **priority is given to Government school students**, however if vacancies exist we may offer places to non-Government school students where no boarding facilities are offered.

Examples of some specialised courses offered at nearby metropolitan Government high schools:

Kent Street SHS: Aviation, Cricket, Netball, Fashion & Design, Earth Science, Trade Training

Como Secondary College: Hockey, Golf, Music, EMITS

The application and placement process

Applications for boarding may be submitted at any time throughout the year. Families need to attach recommendations and references from their current school when submitting documentation.

First round offers will be sent to prospective families between September and December for the following year. A waiting list applies for those not offered a place in the initial round and families may be contacted as vacancies arise.

Please be advised:

- At all times boarding students need to demonstrate commitment and focus to their school studies in order to continue to hold their place at Rotary Residential College.
- Parents must satisfy themselves that their child can access public transport to school as Rotary Residential College does not provide a school of extra-curricular transportation service;
- Families eligible for Government boarding subsidies and allowances must arrange for payments to be credited directly to Rotary Residential College.
- At all times all families need to ensure that boarding fees are paid in accordance with the payment schedule in order for their child to continue to hold their place at Rotary Residential College.
